



OASIS OF THE SEAS FAST FACTS:

Ship & Crew:

- 1.7 million hours were spent designing the Oasis involving 15 architectural firms.
- Oasis uses more than 3,000 miles of electrical wiring. The wiring could stretch across America – coast to coast!
- Oasis is 1,187 feet long, 208 feet wide, and its 18 decks rise 213 feet above the waterline.
- It has taken 650,000 liters of paint so far to paint the interior and exterior.
- The total area of the Oasis is 2.4 million square feet
- The average crew member has 2.5 years of experience working on a cruise ship totaling 5,000 – cumulative years of customer service.
- 95% of the crew working on the Oasis of the Seas will come from other Royal Caribbean ships.

AquaTheater & Sports Zone:

- Features the first zip line on a cruise ship, a thrilling 82 feet ride in the Sports Zone, suspended nine decks above the Boardwalk.
- The first ship to feature not one, but two FlowRiders in the Sports Zone.
- The longest jogging track at sea; one lap around the track will be 0.43 miles – 2.4 laps will equal a mile.
- The AquaTheater pool is 21 feet deep, making it the deepest pool at sea.
- It takes 139,000 gallons of water to fill the AquaTheater pool, more than all the pools on the Freedom of the Seas combined.
- The first beach pool at sea on the pool deck has a sloped entry where guests can wade into the water or relax in colorful beach chairs under an umbrella as the water rolls gently beneath.
- The AquaTheater features first-ever acrobatic, synchronized and high-dive performances on the high seas with a talent cast of Olympic and National Collegiate Athletic Association divers.
- The Tony-award winning Broadway musical Hairspray, marking the first full Broadway show performed on any cruise ship.



Neighborhoods:

- Central Park neighborhood is the first-ever park at sea, with 12,175 plants, 62 vine plants, 56 trees and bamboo – some over 24 feet high. There are also full-time horticulturists who will give guided tours.
- The only original, handcrafted carousel at sea is the centerpiece of the unique Boardwalk neighborhood.
- The Coach store in Oasis of the Seas' Central Park is the only free-standing, Coach luxury leather boutique at sea.
- The unique Rising Tide bar the first ever moving bar at sea takes about six minutes to transit from the Royal Promenade (deck five) to Central Park (deck eight) – or vice versa.
- Oasis' Royal Promenade is twice as wide as those on the Freedom- and Voyager-class vessels. The original Royal Promenade was inspired by a Baltic ferry, which featured a similar promenade.

Technology:

- For the first time, guests can make reservations prior to sailing for onboard theatrics performances, specialty restaurants, and spa services; sign up for the flexible My Time Dining program and digitally sign a one-time activities waiver before setting foot onboard Oasis of the Seas.
- To control traffic flow, restaurants use technology that measures the head count, so that passengers can see which restaurants are busy from their stateroom televisions and on displays throughout the ship.
- Electronic mustering means that you're no longer required to don your life jacket for the safety drill, and there's no name calling to check off passenger participation. Life jackets, in fact, are stored at the muster stations, and not in the staterooms.
- Photo Finder integrates your check-in photo with photos taken on board, so that there is no more scanning the picture walls to find your photo. Kiosks will offer the ability to swipe your stateroom card and see all of the photos taken of you on a voyage.
